The members of the Local Arrangements Committee (LAC) heartily welcome the 2025 Annual Conference to Columbus, Ohio. Aside from Chicago, the only other Midwest cities to host the AAS Annual Conference have been Ann Arbor, Michigan and Cleveland, Ohio—both in the 1950s.

Columbus has various nicknames:

- Discovery City in reference to the explorations of Christopher Columbus, the city's namesake
- Cap City a nod to Columbus being Ohio's state capital
- Arch City for the arches that lit High Street in the 1880s; these were reconstructed in the
 early 2000s, and you can catch sight of them in the Short North neighborhood, just north of the
 Greater Columbus Convention Center
- Cowtown a monicker referencing the farm fields next to the classrooms of the Ohio
 Agricultural and Mechanical College, which later became The Ohio State University
- and the abbreviated "Cbus."

No matter what you call it, we have various excursions planned for you to take of nearby cultural highlights in our city. There are exhibitions of Asian art and material culture, including the exhibition *The Silk Road*, located in the convention center's Ohio Center B&C Meeting Rooms.

Performances by artists invited by the LAC will pop up on Friday and Saturday in the foyer of the Union Station Ballrooms. And we will proudly feature Cleveland DJ "Big Sana" at the AAS Member Cocktail Reception on Friday evening.

We are excited to extend Midwestern hospitality to the AAS memb<mark>ership and hope many of you will choose to visit again.</mark>


